Athletic passes are now available for the 2010-2011 school year. Passes will be good for all home athletic events.

Make check payable to Badin Athletics and specify which pass or passes you are purchasing. Passes will be mailed to your home.

Consider the value...

- If an adult attends all athletic events it will cost \$300.
- If a high school student attends all athletic events and buys pre-sale for home football and home boys' basketball it will cost \$190.
- If grades 1-8 and senior citizens attend all athletic events it would cost \$156.

Consider the convenience...

- Passes will be presented at the gate of all home athletic events. You will no longer stand in line to purchase a game ticket.
- You will no longer need to purchase pre-sale tickets for home games.
- When two or more sports are playing at home on the same night, you will be able to go to multiple events and not be charged for each event.

Consider the advantages...

- Promote school spirit by attending more athletic events than you have in the past because your admission fee has been pre-paid.
- Students will no longer pay full price at home football and basketball because they forgot to buy their tickets pre-sale.
- Not unlike a credit card, you no longer need cash to gain admittance to home games.
- Could be given as a gift.

SENIOR PARENTS

The guidance department wishes to offer our congratulations to the class of 2010. It has been a joy to work with your sons and daughters as well as the enjoyment in getting to know their families. You are always welcome to visit and to update us on future successes as well as when needing some additional support from this office.

Transcripts are sent to the institution specified by each student during the later part of the month of June. Please give us a call if any plans have changed regarding this procedure. Also, please be aware that transcripts are held until all fees and any other financial obligations are met.

Mrs. Bucheit and I pride ourselves on making timely responses to all messages that we receive. Phone messages and written requests addressed specifically to us may not be responded to from mid June through mid August as the guidance office will be closed for the summer. The main offices will be opened during the summer but may have reduced hours. Be sure to listen to any office messages regarding times, dates etc.

JUNIOR PARENTS

Once again, it is very important for the junior students to complete their packets and to return them to the guidance office as soon as is possible if not already done so. Letters of recommendation are needed from those faculty members, coaches and/or employers who know your son or daughter well. Please have your child address or readdress that need through contact with these professionals. Well written letters of recommendation give strong support which, in turn, may possibly create additional positives through acceptances and financial awards offered by various institutions. Parents, please complete your section (last page) of the packet.

Also, each junior was given a packet of information that should be used as a guideline for investigating colleges etc. Websites as well as pieces of advice are included for use when making college visits etc. Hopefully, you will find this packet helpful in gathering information as well as relieving any possible stresses during this time of exploration.

The summer is a good time to look over strategies when taking the SAT and ACT tests. The websites are published in the junior packet. Students can access practice tests for free and can concentrate on identified weaknesses when visiting these sites. The PSAT test reports are a wonderful tool in providing a wealth of information about the SAT test as well as career searches, personality tests, majors and colleges that may be a "good fit" when logging into "Mycollegequickstart." An identification code is needed—listed on your child's PSAT report.

Lastly, the Badin website lists many summer opportunities to earn possible college credits and to experience dorm life on various campuses during the summer months. If interested, look under Guidance and view the two bulletins. You may also wish to become familiar with the scholarship bulletins that were published this year for our seniors. It is always a good idea to become familiar with the types of formats and processes that will probably be required of your child next year.

Finally, we had a special guest making her first Kairos in June, Mrs. Ellen Baden, who is a Badin mom and 2nd Grade Teacher at St. Joseph Consolidated School. I simply cannot express my gratitude for everyone who makes these retreats possible. Please keep our groups in your prayers while we're on retreat and know that we pray for the entire Badin community throughout our retreats.

We are implementing a few changes to the retreat costs for the 2010 – 2011 school year:

- Freshman Day of Recollection will now cost \$10 per student
- Sophomore Day of Recollection will now cost \$45 per student
- JOY Junior Retreat will cost \$50 per student
- Kairos will continue to be included in the senior fee.

These costs pay for food, transportation, lodging and / or programming, and a variety of retreat supplies. We hope you and your student will find that each retreat is well worth the money spent for the faith development experience!

This year the Office of Campus Ministry is sponsoring a **Summer Service Retreat** which will be held at Badin during the month of August. Through the generosity of the Hamilton Community Foundation Youth Philanthropy Grant, students will have an opportunity to work with those most in need in our local community to make a difference in their lives while growing together in faith and friendship. Christian Service Requirement Update

Dear Friends,

As a part of our ongoing discernment of Christ's call to serve as leaders in our Church and in our world, the Office of Campus Ministry has proposed the following changes in Christian service hour requirements, effective for the 2010 – 2011 academic year:

- Freshmen are required to complete 10 hours of Christian service from approved service opportunities.
- Sophomores are required to complete 15 hours of Christian service from approved service opportunities.
- Juniors are required to complete 20 hours of Christian service, all of which must be earned through non-profit social service agencies. Examples of such agencies include St. Raphael's, Serve City, Shared Harvest Food Bank, Habitat for Humanity, St. Vincent de Paul, Catholic Charities, local homeless shelters, soup kitchens, assisted living facilities and the like. A complete listing of *approved* agencies will be posted on the Badin campus ministry website.
- Seniors are required to complete 20 hours of Christian service, with at least 10 of these hours coming from the non-profit social service agencies listed above. The balance of seniors' service requirement may come from other *approved* service opportunities.

All students will be permitted to earn up to five (5) service hours through a Badin-related service opportunity, such as summer sports camps, service projects associated with Badin clubs or organizations, DECA fundraisers, etc. Students may earn additional hours (beyond the 5 Badin hour limit) by helping with Badin's Celebration.

In addition, students must submit completed service hour forms to the Christian service coordinator *no later than* 30 days after the actual service event or activity. For example, if a student helps at their parish festival held on Saturday, July 3, they will have until Saturday, August 1 to submit them for credit. Students may drop off completed service hour forms at the main office during regular summer hours or students may mail completed service hour forms to the Christian service coordinator c/o Badin High School.

Finally, the tentative due dates for service hours during the 2010 – 2011 academic year will be Monday, May 16 for seniors and Monday, May 23 for all other students.

All other service hour rules and guidelines apply, unless explicitly stated above.

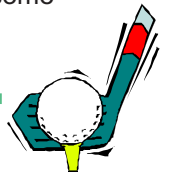
