

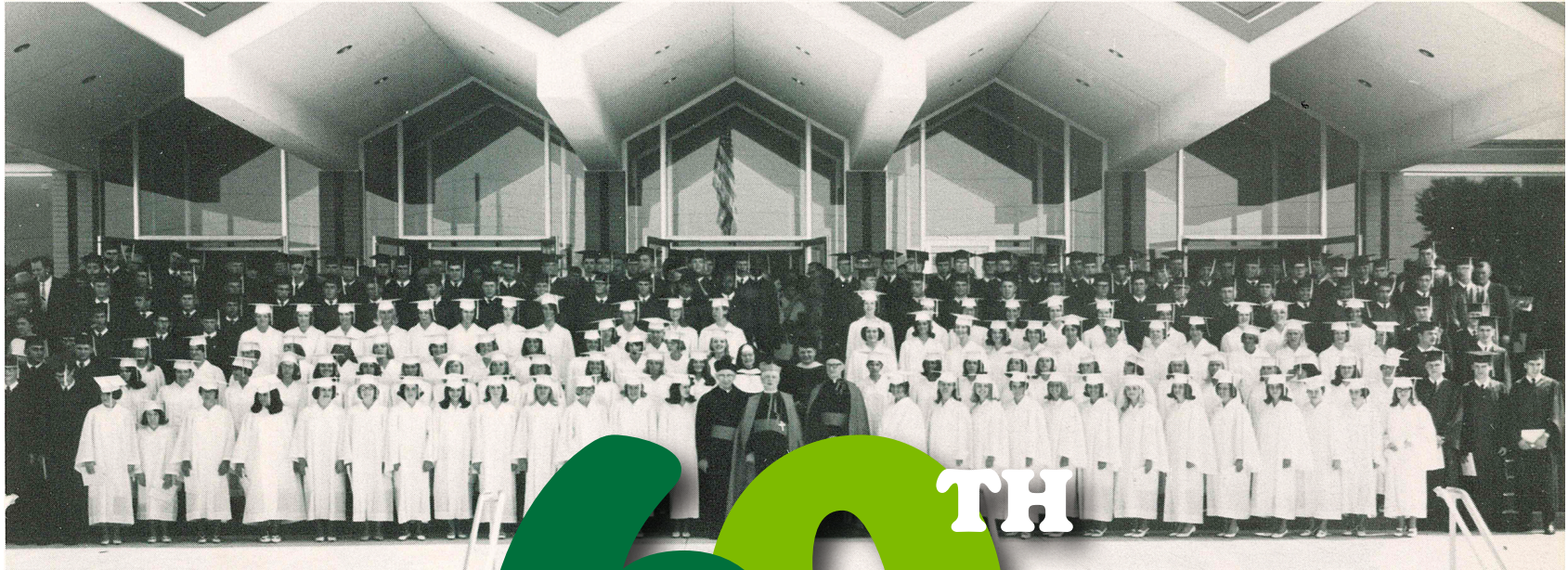

BADIN HIGH SCHOOL - *from the beginning...*

The fundraising to build Badin High School started in August of 1962. All 10 of the parishes in the Hamilton and Fairfield areas united to raise the funds necessary to build the school. Building Badin would be a historical milestone in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati as it would be the first co-institutional high school in the Archdiocese. The campaign was led by Hamilton attorney Marc A. Fiehrer and he was assisted by Lawrence Schlemann and Clarence G. Wehr. A campaign headquarters was established on the 2nd floor at 230 Dayton Street next to the rectory of St. Stephen's Parish. Committees were formed in each of the parishes to help with the project. The chairs in each of the parishes were:

These men, along with hundreds more in each parish, spent one day, Sunday, September 23, 1962, going door-to-door soliciting for the funds to build Badin. It was a very successful day and the plans to build Badin moved forward with a ground breaking ceremony held on April 11, 1965.

Badin opened its doors for the first day of school on Wednesday, September 7, 1966 with Fr. Francis Miller as Principal, Sister Vincent (Anne) Feth SNDdeN and Mr. Terry Malone serving as the Vice Principals. The official blessing and dedication took place on October 23, 1966 with His Grace, The Most Reverend Archbishop Karl J. Alter, the Archbishop of Cincinnati presiding over the ceremonies.

Our first faculty had 11 priests and 19 sisters from various orders with an additional 18 lay teachers. Tuition was \$140 per student with an additional \$30 general fee that included book rentals and other general fees. A hot lunch was \$.40 and \$2 parking fee for the year. My how times have changed!

Since that first year, we've had 10,365 students walk the halls and graduate from Badin High School. Our graduates continue to go out and change the world in all that they do - and we are proud of each and every one of them! We look forward to continuing to celebrate our 60th Anniversary throughout the year!

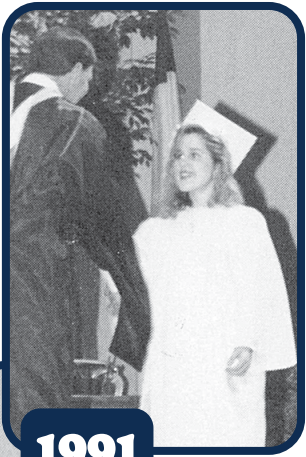

Dear Alumni and Friends,

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Patrick Coyne '11 has taken training to the next level



Patrick Coyne '11 says that he's "drinking from a fire hose every day," then quickly adds with a smile, "But I like the water."

Coyne has taken physical training to a new level at his Black Sheep Performance center in Blue Ash, a state-of-the-art facility where serious athletes can get fit, be fit and stay fit.

"I'm just obsessed with health and wellness," he said. "I'm intense – I coach people hard. I ran at this opportunity with reckless abandon."

Coyne, at age 33, is now running two multi-million dollar businesses, as he and Moeller High grad and former Cincinnati Bengals defensive end Sam Hubbard are partners in Contrast Studios, a spa sauna and cold tub operation that currently has three locations in Greater Cincinnati.

"Gyms are not an easy business to make money in," he said. "You can't fake business acumen. I have a high price-point, but I want to take it as big as we can."

Going "big" has always been a part of Coyne's mindset, but it hasn't always worked out.

One of the Top 10 quarterback prospects in the country as a senior at Badin High School, he suffered a knee injury in the first game of the season. He worked hard and came back in time to actually catch a 15-yard touchdown pass – it left him with tears of joy – in a 23-0 playoff victory at Richwood North Union, but that was just the start of some difficult years.

His college football career bounced him from the University of Cincinnati to Indiana State, and Coyne admitted, "I'd fallen out of love with the game. That ship had run its course. I never really bought into the mental aspect of the game ... it was just the physical aspect to me. Things just didn't pan out."

They got worse in Miami, Florida.

"I went to Miami Beach with the idea of trying to be famous," he recalled. "I thought I'd become wealthy. I woke up one day and I just wasn't happy with things. I'd hit rock bottom. I decided to come home and open a gym."

That was 2018, and he had a gym charging \$15 an hour in a place next to his parents' house. That was then – and this is now. He's expanding Black Sheep Performance from 11,000 to 25,000 square feet. He's gone from one to 19 employees. He's opening a new AI integrated facility next to his current gym, which will be a 24/7 badge-in operation with no employees necessary.

"All I wanted was to make \$100,000 a year," he said. "Once I surpassed that,

things got more intense. Now I'm a fire fighter – putting out fires every day. If I don't have a problem to fix, I create one."

He speaks rapidly, always with a smile – because he obviously enjoys what he's doing.

"I was trying to figure out a brand and where I would take it," Coyne noted. "I always felt like a black sheep. I had people coming to a place where they felt comfortable chasing big goals. I had to figure out a way to scale up a real business."

Sam Hubbard showed up one day, worked out, and told Coyne, "I'll see you tomorrow," and has never left. On the day of our interview, Hubbard's wife was working out in Coyne's gym.

His client list includes four of the seven CEOs of major companies in Greater Cincinnati, as well as two of the four area billionaires. On the wall in the gym are jerseys from numerous high-profile athletes, as Coyne trains the Bengals' Joe Burrow, USA women's soccer star Rose Lavelle, Bengals' defensive end Shemar Stewart, new Bengals' defensive back Bryan Cook and so many others.

He's been featured on the NFL Network, Barstool Sports, the Golf Channel, done several Ted Talks and counts national broadcaster and former Ohio State quarterback Kirk Herbstreit as an important mentor.



"I try to get kids to understand where I went wrong, and what I would have done differently" Coyne said. "I don't look like my peers. I wish I could have learned how to hold myself up earlier in life."

Coyne and his wife, Cassidy, are the parents of two children – Murphy, age 3; and Colter, 7 months. In high school, he had transferred to Badin from LaSalle, and concedes, "I'd have had a rough time in high school wherever I went."

He points to then Badin Principal Frank Margello and Assistant Principal Brian Pendergest '90 as "the first time I ever trusted anybody in authority. Mr. P sent me a note on Kairos that changed the trajectory of my life. No one had ever told me that I was smart.

"I had ADHD, dyslexia, you name it. Mr. P told me that I had potential, that I could succeed just the way I was," he added. "I fell in love with education. I needed to learn how to learn. It started with a few good people who believed in me at Badin High School."

Now, Coyne's gym has national exposure. He's had prospective NFL players coming in to do workouts before the NFL Combine, and will have 18-20 rostered players in during June and July to get ready for training camp.

He's come a long way, and he appreciates it.

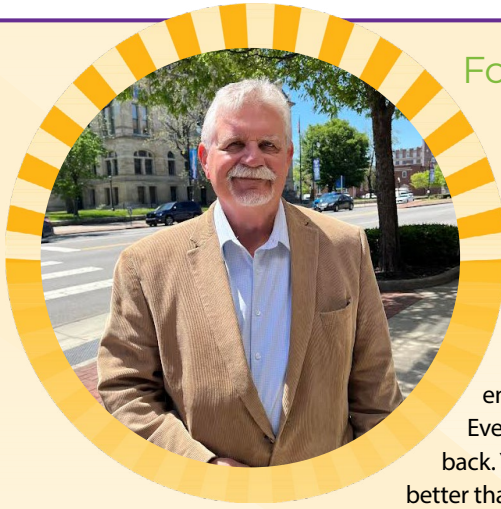
"Things are going well," he nodded. "I focus on the small details. I had about 20 clients a few years ago, I signed a huge loan – and now here we are."

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT Dean Bruewer '74

For Dean Bruewer '74, it's all about getting things done



Dean Bruewer '74 likes to operate under the radar and get things done – and he says it's just the way he was raised.

"There were 10 in our family," he recalled. "We never had much, but we always had enough to give to other people. Everybody did something to give back. You try to leave a place better than how you found it."

"I've done a lot of stuff – if it's not your passion, why do it?"

Now retired, Bruewer is a 1979 graduate of Miami University who held various management positions in manufacturing engineering for more than four decades with General Motors, Toyota, Ford Motor and Ethicon Endo Surgery.

The energetic Bruewer doesn't want a lot of attention or credit – but in retirement he's turned his sights to two significant events: the Miami River Cleanup, which took place on May 2nd; and the Great American Bike Rally, scheduled for mid-September.

A Fairfield resident, Bruewer is a member of Hamilton Rotary Club and notes, "There's too much friction between the two communities. We need to do things to bring the two cities together."

He helped spearhead the second year of the river cleanup, in conjunction with Fairfield Rotary, and noted, "Hamilton Rotary is trying to reinvent itself, and we thought we'd take ownership of this event. But it's great to see the two clubs work together on the cleanup, which went from Hamilton to the low-level dam and back."

In retirement, Bruewer started riding a bike for exercise and quickly got hooked. He thought, "Let's do a fundraiser!" and in 2019, 80 riders raised \$8,000.

"We decided to keep doing it," he nodded of the Great American Bike Rally. "It benefits the Boys and Girls Club of Hamilton – we've raised a total of \$70,000 – so, about \$10,000 per year. What organization better embodies the opportunity to give back to kids?"

Bruewer would like the GABR to become a major event – going from the current 70 or so riders each year to several hundred riders.

"It's a sustainable event," Bruewer said, noting that the state of Ohio has more bike trails than any state in the union. If the local bike path could be extended to Trenton, that would in fact create a secure trail from Hamilton to Lake Erie.

"Right now there is a trail from Ohio to Erie Trail (OTET) which goes from Cincinnati to Lake Erie. It would be great to have a Miami to Erie Trail (MTET) from our community," said Bruewer, who rode a trail from Pittsburgh to Washington DC several years ago.

Finishing a trail to Trenton, he pointed out, would also create an opportunity for a major race from Hamilton to Dayton and back – 50 miles each way. "That could be a tri-state event that would bring the peloton racers out!"

One rewarding facet of the current Great American Bike Rally is bicycles for children. Bruewer gets used bikes and refurbishes some 20 each year, and gives them to families who might like a bike.

"We give them to the parents for their kids," Bruewer said. "To see the kids with their bikes is just so rewarding. The kids are riding the bikes that their moms just got. That's really special."

Bruewer and his wife, Maureen Weislogel Bruewer '74, are the parents of two children. Aaron '98 is at the University of DC in Washington, and Alicia '03 is a Cincinnati Police Officer, and former SWAT team member. She and her husband, Carl Shircliff, are the parents of one child.

Flub's celebrating six decades of success

Sixty years of success with many more years to come – that's the sub and substance of one of the most popular businesses in the area, Flub's Ice Cream.

Google the organization and the lead link says it all: Delicious Ice Cream Treats Since 1966.

"A lot of work, a lot of dedication and guidance from God," says Brian Connaughton '90, the second-generation owner/operator of Flub's, with his son, Noah '17, now in a management role as well.

Asked the rewards of running his own business, Brian is quick with an answer, and a chuckle: "Five months off! We work the same amount of hours as most people, it's just that we do it in a seven-month span. We work 60-70 hours a week from March 1st to October 1st."



Noah, who played tennis at the University of Dayton before graduating from Ohio University, said of his return to the business, "I don't feel like I ever really left. I'm happy to be involved – I've always enjoyed it. It's kind of been the plan since high school."

There are three Flub's locations – on Eaton Avenue in Hamilton, on Hamilton Cleves Road in Ross and on Wessel Drive in Fairfield.

"I feel like an average guy – I just sell ice cream," said Brian with sincere modesty. He and his wife, the former Jodie Burkhardt '89, oversee the successful business. "I'm proud of what we've done, absolutely. I'm sure my parents are, too."

Brian's father, Mike, was a school teacher for 35 years. His degree was in Hotel & Restaurant

We've all known the Fritsch name in the Badin community. They are one of those many school families who've shared their time and talents with Hamilton Catholic, Notre Dame and Badin through the years. Maybe you've heard of one of the younger members of the Fritsch family - Abby Fritsch '12. If not, you certainly should!

We had the chance to sit down with

Abby recently...kind of a catch-up, to what she's doing now. And we weren't surprised one bit that the compassion and fine work ethic she demonstrated at Badin are still intact!

Abby admits that, as a college freshman, a trip to El Salvador gave her a "reality check" of what the world was like. So down the road, armed with a Badin diploma, a bachelor's degree in health administration from Xavier University and a Master's in public administration from Northern Kentucky University, Abby was on her way to making a difference in the world.

Moving to Denver, CO, to serve as a volunteer with the faith-based Colorado Vincentian Volunteer program, Abby began her work with the underprivileged. When her year of service was over, Abby became a program specialist for a Denver food pantry and clothing bank.

Upon Abby's return "home", she continued her service to others, as a social worker in Butler County. One of those jobs was investigating cases of child abuse and neglect. In another role, Abby served as a program manager, who oversaw a local women's substance use residential treatment facility, where up to 30 women could be residing at any given time.

Hamilton County soon became the beneficiary of Abby's talents and heart, as she became a social program administrator in their Office of Addiction Response. Currently, Abby plays a critical leadership role in advancing countywide strategies

to combat substance use and promote recovery. Overseeing a complex \$20+ million portfolio of federal, state and local funding, Abby is responsible for fiscal stewardship and compliance and brings together public agencies, health providers and community partners to strengthen Hamilton County's collaborative efforts.

The daughter of Steve '73 and Maureen Fritsch, Abby cites her Dad as her biggest influence, personally and professionally. As a psychologist - helping others - is a calling for Steve, and Abby, I'd say, is following suit. Abby is quick to credit her parents' sacrifice that ensured that Abby and her siblings could attend Catholic schools. And we're so glad they did!

When asked if Abby had any advice for current Badin students, she said

"Get involved! You never know what connection or conversation could end up striking a passion within you. Take every opportunity to immerse yourself in experiences that expand your knowledge of the world. It's difficult to have empathy until you walk alongside others."

While at Badin, Abby was involved in Student Council, served as a Badin Ambassador, was a Kairos leader, a J. Kyle Braid Scholar, played girls basketball and soccer, and a member of National Honor Society. Since leaving Badin, Abby has enjoyed seeing the school's growth... the diversity of enrollment... the increase in student service projects... and the expansion of the campus ministry department, athletics and the arts.

Abby Fritsch has an "old soul", a kind heart and a sharp mind. A tattoo that Abby sports - the motto from an organization she has been involved in for kids from Uganda - "Be the Light" isn't just a motto. Abby Fritsch '12 truly strives to be that.

She's the kind of alumni that Badin is proud to call its own. And we certainly are!



Management, and in 1966, he and his wife, Ann, bought the Wagonfield Dairy Bar, which was located next to the current Flub's operation in Hamilton.

"I started working there when I was 10, so this will be my 44th summer," Brian said, noting that the Fairfield location opened in 2010 and Ross in 2016. "The biggest challenge is having to manage 85 employees. That's a lot of kids - for most of them, this is their first job."

Noah pointed to the business's community support. "We've been able to build a great following. We see the same faces day after day. Most people are in a pretty good mood when they come for ice cream. They're the kids - and then they become the parents and they're bringing their kids."

Flub's Hamilton operation is able to keep customers in that good mood with their quality of service - with cars snaking up Eaton Road during the summer days, they're able to handle 100 to 120 cars per hour at the drive thru.

Brian noted that they have increased their ability to do outside events with three trucks and a concession trailer, doing some 200 events per summer - including

such things as having a truck at the Thyssenkrupp Bilstein facility on Bilstein Boulevard from 1:30-3 a.m. on back-to-back nights.

"We've got product ordering down to a science," said Brian. "They deliver three days a week. Ice cream is a perishable product. We sell at such a high volume that it never has a chance to go stale."

Noah pointed to Badin High School when he name-checked "the best customer service person I know" - the late Joe DeAngelo, Badin's longtime Marketing Education director - when he noted the value of training employees on customer service.

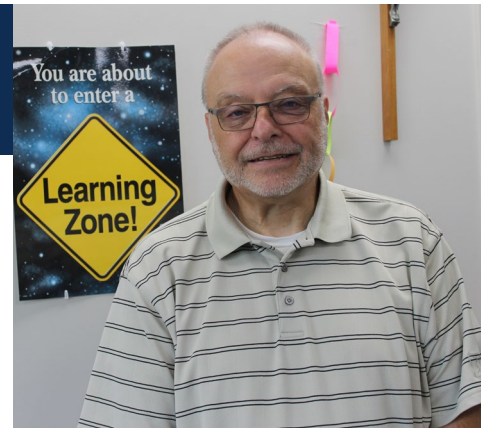
"It's lots of hard work, but it's nice to keep the business in the family," Noah said. "Our entire family has been involved, and it's still that way."

YOU WILL BE MISSED!

When Dr. Mark O'Hara (pictured on left) and Bill Valerius (pictured on right) departed Badin High School for the final time following the graduation of the Class of 2026, they took with them decades of skill and dedication to the interests of young people.

The two combined for 86 years – 44 for Valerius, 42 for O'Hara – of educational expertise, nearly half of them (41 years) in the halls of Badin High School.



"I never really thought that this day would come," said Valerius, who created the Academic Support Program at Badin in 2012, a critical enhancement for student opportunities at BHS. "I knew that I wanted to be a teacher when I was in the fourth grade. You think, where did the time go? It's a career that I would do all over again."

O'Hara, from New Jersey, came to Miami University for grad school and fell in love with this area of the state. He has taught English at Badin for 27 years, through all four grades at various points in his tenure. His outstanding efforts included directing plays and hosting talent shows, and creating popular electives like Introduction to Film and Creative Writing.

"These two men have really left a great legacy at Badin High School," Principal Patrick Keating '07 said. "They laid the groundwork for so many important initiatives, followed through on their success, and have had such a positive impact on things that will live on beyond their retirement. They will be missed, but hardly forgotten."

"I've always loved being a classroom teacher," said O'Hara, who has also been an adjunct professor in Miami University for three decades. "And it's been very rewarding teaching at a Christian school. I've had my own faith affirmed, and I've been able to interact with students when they ask me about my faith."

Valerius worked for 30 years in the Hamilton City School District, serving for 15 years as the director of the Special Education program there. When he retired, he came to work at Badin – his three children are Badin graduates – and started the Academic Support Program. Today, the program supports more than 10 percent of the student body.

"You don't realize, sometimes, the impact you have had on so many students over the years," Valerius said. "The impact you have had on their mental health, in giving them some self-confidence – self-confidence where they could go out and live out their dreams, whatever dreams those are."

"Kids are still kids – learning and growing," said O'Hara, who came to Badin after 13 years at Union County (Ind.) High School, just over the border from Butler County. "They have more stress because of pressure and

distractions, primarily from social media. But the majority are fantastic kids. They share my enthusiasm for language, and how we can use language to become better citizens, to value freedom and think more deeply."

Valerius was named Badin's 2019 "Educator of the Year" in the Harry T. Wilks Hamilton Celebrates Education program sponsored by the Hamilton Community Foundation. He had stepped into a part-time role at Badin for the past two years.

"The Academic Support program encompasses two things that are at the top for me – my faith and my teaching," Valerius said. "Family is No. 1, and these students are like a family. I've had some students say I'm like a dad to them. That's fine with me. I've always said that I teach students as if they were mine."

O'Hara recalled that his mother "always told me that education was something that people could never take away from you. She grew up in the Great Depression, and a lot of things were taken away at that time."

His favorite book to teach was "The Great Gatsby" by F. Scott Fitzgerald.

"Students would ask me, 'Dr. O'Hara, when are we going to read a happy book?' I often respond, 'This is American Lit and we have always struggled,'" he said with a smile. "Tragedy is a part of life. Maybe you realize your life is not so tragic after you read King Lear and The Great Gatsby."

Valerius, a Cincinnati native, is married to the former Theresa Riedel '77, and their sons are Sam '04, John '07 and Greg '09.

O'Hara and his wife were married on St. Patrick's Day in 1984 and are the parents of two Badin grads – Billy '03 and Kristin '06.

O'Hara called teaching "a difficult profession because it demands so much more time than the public recognizes. At the same time, it's a very rewarding profession. You are interacting with young adults who are going to end up running the world. When they come back and give you feedback on what a positive impact your work has had, obviously that's a good day."

Even, the daughter of Rob and Christy Even of Fairfield and a graduate of Sacred Heart School, is one of the most decorated female athletes to ever graduate from Badin.

As a senior, she was named first team All-Ohio in soccer as well as first team All-Ohio in basketball – the first BHS female athlete to earn that prestigious “double.”

She was named the GCL Coed Division Player of the Year in both sports. And overall, Braelyn earned five league Player of the Year awards during her career. She helped lead the Rams to the Elite Eight game three times in basketball, and the soccer team to the state finals in 2025.

Even recovered from two serious knee injuries as a teenager, including one that kept her off the high school soccer field as a junior.

“I look at those as a blessing,” she said of the injuries. “There’s a mental game that you have to go through – those injuries helped me mentally because they helped me appreciate everything about being able to play sports.”

She leaves Badin as the leading scorer in the history of the basketball program, girls or boys, with 1,593 points. “That’s kind of ironic because that was the sport I just played for fun,” she smiled. “But now it’s kind of hit me that I’m finished playing basketball. Happy that it happened – sad that it’s over.”

Even – named an All-American by United Soccer Coaches – has been a part of the United States U-18/19 national women’s soccer program, traveling to Portugal in October 2025 and being in the starting lineup in two “friendlies” against Ireland and Portugal.

She enjoyed the BHS girls’ soccer season, which ended with a 1-0 setback to defending Division III state champion Bay Village Bay at Historic Crew Stadium in Columbus in November. It was Badin’s first trip to the state finals since 2014.

“The seniors (10) on the team were so close,” Even said. “That was super cool, probably the most enjoyable season I’ve ever played.”

Looking back on her prep experience, Even said, “I’m going to miss high school, but I’m super ready for the next thing.” And then she emphasized, “This has been *so much fun*.”

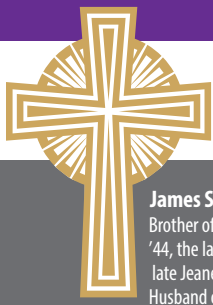
