

DRESS CODE

Badin has established a dress code and uniform requirements in order to keep students focused on the pursuit of academic development, personal growth, and faith, rather than fashion. Students are required to follow the dress code from the beginning of the school day until dismissal. Students not in compliance with the dress code will be subject to detention and immediately required to make whatever changes are necessary to comply with the dress code, including but not limited to changing, or having a parent bring appropriate clothing. Parents are expected to support the school's policy by ensuring their son or daughter complies with the dress code.

These guidelines are not to be considered all-inclusive. The Administration reserves the right to address dress code issues deemed inappropriate.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. General appearance should be conservative.
2. No visible body piercing except girls' earrings. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings. Band-Aids or spacers may not be worn to cover up body piercing.
3. No visible tattoos. Tattoos must be covered up during school hours and when representing Badin in an extracurricular event.
4. Hair styles must be conservative.
5. Hair color must be a natural color.
6. Jewelry must be conservative and limited.
7. Hats may not be worn in the building during school hours (7:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.).
8. Clothing may not be soiled, tight, torn or frayed.
9. No denim-colored or striped slacks may be worn.
10. Patches, insignias, buttons, jewelry or other items that include obscene, violent, gang, tobacco, drug or alcohol related writing or images are not acceptable.
11. Long sleeve undershirts may not be worn under short sleeve polo shirts.
12. Badges must be worn around the neck.

STUDENT IDENTIFICATION BADGES

Student ID badges are part of the uniform and must be on a lanyard and visible at all times. Students are not permitted to cover up his/her name and photo. Students who forget or lose their ID badge must report to the main office at the start of the school day for a temporary badge. Each time a temporary badge is assigned, an infraction will be recorded into FACTS. Students will receive three infractions for the school year before discipline is assigned. Students who lose their badge will be issued a new badge and assessed a \$10.00 fee which will be added to their FACTS account. Students whose badge breaks must turn them into the office for an assessment. A replacement will be issued free of charge, provided the broken badge was not willfully destroyed.

DAILY UNIFORM GUIDELINES

ALL STUDENTS

SHIRTS

- A white or green Badin polo shirt must be worn daily.
- A plain white shirt is the only undergarment that may be worn beneath the polo shirt and must be tucked into the skirt/pants if it is longer than the polo shirt.

SWEATSHIRTS & QUARTER ZIPS

- Monday - Thursday students may wear the school approved Badin quarter zip or crewneck over the Badin polo.



- Friday students may wear any Badin sweatshirt or quarter zip.

SOCKS & SHOES

- Socks must be worn daily.
- Dress shoes or tennis shoes may be worn year round.

MALE STUDENTS

SHORTS & PANTS

- Traditional, solid colored khaki/tan or gray shorts or long pants must be worn. Unacceptable shorts/pants include, but are not limited to cargo style, painter, denim, striped or jean style pants, pants with drawstrings, jogger pants, and pants with “rivets” are may not be worn.
- Bottoms must be worn at the waist and may not be tight or oversized.
- Bottoms must be clean with no tears or frays.
- Rolling the hemline of shorts is not permitted.

GROOMING

- Hair must be neatly groomed and conservative in nature. Hair cannot be below the eyebrows or hang below the shoulders.
- Males are required to be clean-shaven with sideburns stopping at the bottom of the ear.

FORMAL ATTIRE - Males are permitted to wear formal uniform at any time. Students choosing to wear button-down dress shirts are required to wear a tie and full length dress pants.

FEMALE STUDENTS

SWEATERS - Uniform sweaters may be worn over the Badin polo shirt at any time of the year.

SKIRTS, PANTS & BOTTOMS

- Uniform skirts and pants must be purchased through School Bells or Shaheen's.
- Skirts must provide modest coverage and are not permitted to be rolled. Skirts may not be shorter than 3 inches above the knee.
- Traditional, solid colored khaki/tan or black long pants or cropped pants are permitted.
- Bottoms must be worn at the waist or higher and may not be tight or oversized.
- Bottoms must be clean with no tears or frays.
- Only black, white, gray, navy or dark green "tights" are permitted to be worn with the skirt.

SPECIAL EVENT GUIDELINES

Occasionally, special dress codes will be used for specific events and fundraisers. Students who choose not to participate in the special dress days are required to be in daily uniform attire. Students not in compliance with the dress code will be subject to detention and immediately required to make whatever changes are necessary to comply with the dress code, including but not limited to changing, or having a parent bring appropriate clothing.

MASS & FORMAL UNIFORM ATTIRE

Students are to be in formal uniform for all Masses, special events and formal assemblies.

MALES: Long dress pants, dress shirt and tie, tennis shoes or dress shoes, and socks. Sweaters may be worn with a shirt and tie.

FEMALES: Uniform skirt, green or white Badin polo shirt, tennis shoes or dress shoes and socks. Sweaters are optional.

OUT-OF-UNIFORM ATTIRE

Out-of-uniform days are generally held to support missions and service projects. In order to participate in out-of-uniform fundraisers, students must pay the minimum donation. Students will receive a receipt which must be placed behind their photo identification badge, as proof of participation. Out-of-uniform apparel must be appropriate, reflecting ideas consistent with and promoting the realities of good education and abide by the following guidelines:

- Shirts and tops must have neck lines which are high enough to cover all cleavage. Halters, midriff tops, spaghetti strap or strapless tops, revealing or mesh tops, etc. are not acceptable.
- Jeans, shorts, sweat pants, overalls, sweaters, sweatshirts, and /or T- shirts are permitted.
- Lower garments are to be worn at the waist and cannot drag the floor.
- Torn or tattered clothing is not to be worn.
- Shorts may not be tight fitting and must provide modest coverage. Tops may not extend past the short and must be tucked in if longer than the short.
- Females – If yoga pants are worn, the top must provide modest coverage of the student's bottom.

SPIRIT DAY ATTIRE

Students must wear a Badin spirit top. Spirit wear may not be covered by a sweatshirt, sweater or jacket that is not Badin spirit wear. Out-of-uniform guidelines apply.
