SHADOW DAYS

Shadow Day details: The day is from 8:00 AM - 12:30 PM on specific dates. It begins with an introduction in the Badin Chapel, then students will attend four classes and enjoy lunch on Badin. Students are able to choose their favorite classes to attend to get a taste of what Badin is like on an ordinary school day.

APPLY TO BADIN HIGH SCHOOL BY DECEMBER 1, 2025

To be considered for admission, students must have applied to Badin High School by the deadline. The application fee is \$20.

ACCEPTANCE INFORMATION

Enrollment at Badin High School is contingent on successful completion of 8th grade and students passing all courses enrolled in during their 8th grade year as well as a clean discipline record until they enroll at Badin in August. Attendance and discipline records are examined as part of the admissions and enrollment process to ensure that students have a good foundation to be successful in high school. Offers of admission may be rescinded for academic, discipline or attendance concerns at the discretion of the Director of Admissions, President or Principal.

ACCURACY OF INFORMATION

Refusing to provide requested information to the school, or providing false, incomplete, or inaccurate information to the school, may result in the denial or revocation of admission and/or disciplinary action, up to and including suspension and expulsion.

COOPERATION AS CONDITION OF ENROLLMENT

If a student, or his/her parent/guardian, behaves in ways that hinders the school from pursuing its mission, objectives, or disciplinary norms, the administration may determine that ABC School is not the appropriate educational environment for that child and the child may be disenrolled. These behaviors include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Lack of respect for the school's/parish's mission, programs, and activities.
- Lack of respect for school/parish employees; hindering them from discharging their duties.
- Lack of respect for school/parish property.

CUSTODY FORM

In cases where students are not living with both biological parents, such as in a divorce or separation, a certified copy of the court order which states who has custody of the child must be on file at the school.

Often parents who do not have custody request information in regard to the child's progress. The school will act in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 3109.05.1 with regard to access to student's records. Students must live with their parents or legal guardian. Whenever a student, regardless of age, is not living with the custodial parent or legal guardian, or changes place of residence during the school year, the parents/guardian and student must meet with the administration to determine what action will be taken.

NON-DISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

No student may be excluded from Badin High School solely because of race, color, national/ethnic origin, or ancestry.

EDUCATING STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Badin High School will evaluate on a case-by-case basis whether or not it can meet the needs of a child with a disability. If the school can make reasonable accommodations to meet the child's needs, then the child may be offered the opportunity to enroll.
