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DRESS CODE

Badin has established a dress code and uniform requirements in order to keep students focused on the pursuit of academic development, personal growth, and faith, rather than fashion. Students are required to follow the dress code from the beginning of the school day until dismissal. Students not in compliance with the dress code will be subject to detention and immediately required to make whatever changes are necessary to comply with the dress code, including but not limited to changing, or having a parent bring appropriate clothing. Parents are expected to support the school's policy by ensuring their son or daughter complies with the dress code.

These guidelines are not to be considered all-inclusive. The Administration reserves the right to address dress code issues deemed inappropriate.

GENERAL DAILY GUIDELINES

1. General appearance should be clean and conservative.
2. Piercings may only be worn in girls' ears. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings. Other visible piercings may not be worn or covered.
3. No visible tattoos. Tattoos must be covered up during school hours and when representing Badin in an extracurricular event.
4. All hair must be of a natural color and conservative. Hair cannot fall in the eyes. Boys' hair cannot hang below the shoulders.
5. Boys are required to be clean-shaven with sideburns stopping at the bottom of the ear.
6. Girls may wear make-up that is not extreme or distracting. Facial stickers and patches are to match one's skin tone.
7. Hats and beanies may not be worn in the building during school hours (7:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.).
8. Clothing may not be soiled, torn or frayed.
9. Jewelry must be conservative and limited. Chains are not permitted.
10. Patches, insignias, buttons, jewelry or other items that disrupt the learning environment or include obscene, violent, gang, tobacco, drug or alcohol related writing or images are not acceptable.
11. Solid black or navy tights or ankle length leggings are permitted to be worn with the skirt. Leggings are not be flared.
12. Student ID badges are to be worn around the neck during school hours.

DAILY UNIFORM GUIDELINES

ALL STUDENTS

SHIRTS

- A white or green Badin polo shirt must be worn daily.
- A plain short sleeve white shirt is the only undergarment that may be worn under the polo. Undershirts that are longer than the polo must be tucked into the skirt/shorts or pants if it is longer than the polo.

APPROVED UNIFORM OUTERWEAR

- Students may wear school approved Badin outerwear over the Badin polo . Approved outwear is available to purchase at Shaheen's.

PANTS

- Traditional, solid colored khaki or gray shorts or long pants must be worn at waist level and may not be tight or oversized. Unacceptable shorts/pants include, but are not limited to cargo style, painter, denim, striped or jean style pants, pants with drawstrings.

SOCKS & SHOES

- Socks must be worn daily.
- Dress shoes or tennis shoes may be worn year round.

MALE SHORTS

Shorts must provide modest coverage and are not permitted to be rolled at the waist or hemline. Shorts may not be shorter than 3 inches above the knee. Material must reach the top of the badge.



FEMALE SKIRTS

Skirts must provide modest coverage and are not permitted to be rolled at the waist or hemline. Skirts may not be shorter than 3 inches above the knee. Material must reach the top of the badge. Skirts must be purchased through Shaheen's.



SPECIAL EVENT GUIDELINES

Occasionally, special dress codes will be used for specific events and fundraisers. Students who choose not to participate in the special dress days are required to be in daily uniform attire. Students not in compliance with the dress code will be subject to disciplinary action and immediately required to make whatever changes are necessary to comply with the dress code, including but not limited to changing, or having a parent bring appropriate clothing.

FLEX FRIDAY ATTIRE

Students may wear any Badin top with uniform bottoms. Flexible footwear is permitted; however, shoes must be safe and have a back (no slides, flip flops or stilettos).

MASS ATTIRE

Students are to be in formal uniform for all Masses, special events and formal assemblies. Males are permitted to wear mass attire at any time. Students choosing to wear a button-down dress shirts are required to wear a tie and full length dress pants. Dress shirts are to be tucked in prior to mass. Mass attire must be worn all day.

MALES: Underclassmen are to be in khaki/tan colored long dress pants, white dress shirt, and Badin tie or bow tie. Senior boys may wear any color dress pants, shirt, tie, and outerwear.



FEMALES: Solid colored long dress pants or uniform skirt, green or white Badin polo shirt under Mass day sweater.



OUT-OF-UNIFORM ATTIRE

Out-of-uniform days are generally held to support missions and service projects. In order to participate in out-of-uniform fundraisers, students must pay the minimum donation. Students will receive a receipt which must be placed behind their photo identification badge, as proof of participation. Students may wear jeans, shorts, sweat pants, overalls, sweaters, sweatshirts, and T-shirts. Out-of-uniform apparel must be appropriate, reflecting ideas consistent with and promoting the realities of good education and abide by the following guidelines:

- Tops must not be sheer or revealing and must fully cover the shoulders, waist, and cleavage. Tops must provide modest coverage of the student's bottom when wearing tights/yoga pants.
- Shorts may not be tight fitting and must provide modest coverage. Tops that extend past shorts must be tucked in if longer than the short.
- Lower garments are to be worn at the waist and cannot drag the floor.
- Torn or tattered clothing is not to be worn.

RAM SPIRIT DAY ATTIRE

Students are out of uniform but must wear a Badin top. Spirit wear may not be covered by any non-Badin outerwear.
